Dear Parents,

The exams are behind us and this morning we had our school's marks approved by the Inspector. The exam session went well. Sadly, we did have six cases where children cheated in an exam. When this happens the child has to appear before the 'irregularities committee' who investigate whether or not cheating took place. We had seven cases reported but only six were declared as cheating and one child was concluded to be not cheating after the meeting. The consequence for cheating in an exam is to be given Zero for that paper. This will definitely pull a pupil's mark down and in an extreme case they may fail that subject.

As I said today we had to present our results to the Department to get them to sign off on all the 'promotions'. Here we are promoting a child from one Grade to another. Now that this has happened we are able to start printing each pupil's **Final Report for 2019**. This will be done ready for issue on **Wednesday, 4 December** at **II a.m.** We will issue a hard copy of the reports on Wednesday.

Parents can also collect these copies from the Front Office on Thursday, 5 December from 8 a.m. – 3 p.m. and Friday, 6 December 2019 from 8 a.m. – 12 p.m.. Also from Thursday parents can log onto the Parent Portal on 'Staffroom' [our computer admin package] and view their child's report online. After 6 December 2019, the office will be closed until Monday, 13 January 2020, 8 a.m. Hard copy reports can again be collected on this day next year.

Just a comment on the Final Report. The Grade Head comments is the comment that will indicate how your child passed to the next Grade, either entirely on their own results or with support from their teacher or the Department of Education. If the word 'adjusted' is included it means that they did not meet the passing requirements, but were assisted to pass by the WCED. This is done for pupils who are 'close' to passing and just need a few more marks here and there to make it. In this case the WCED steps in and 'adjusts' their marks up to a Pass Mark.

Dear 2020 Grade 12 Parent

The last few years' research studies have shown that even students who pass their matric maths exam with distinction experience difficulty with first-year university mathematics. Statistics affirm that only students who achieved 90% or higher in Grade 12 mathematics are able to pass first-year mathematics at university.

Why is this?


