Dear Parents, Guardians & Learners,

ACADEMIC ASSEMBLY

On Friday last week, we hosted an Academic Assembly to celebrate and congratulate learners who made it into the Top Ten in 2020 and also for those who qualified for Honours, Colours or Merit Awards. There were more than 125 learners who attended this assembly, and some parents of the Grade 12 class managed to also attend. Congratulations to all these learners. There will be more information later in this Newsletter on that assembly.

PARENT SUPPORT

A few teachers have expressed concern with the work ethic of some learners in their classes as the learners are not completing the homework assigned to them.

This is particularly evident in the junior grades and we are requesting that parents help us to ensure that their children are completing the homework by the due date, even if the work is not 100% correct.

SGB ELECTIONS

The elections for the teaching staff and non-teaching staff members on the SGB as well as the two

learners from the RCL that will be on the SGB have already taken place. The 7 parent governors still need to be elected and this election will take place on Tuesday, 23 March 2021.

We need at least 125 parents to vote to have a quorum and we are making it as easy as possible by having a drive-through election. Both parents of learners may cast a vote. Only legally appointed guardians of learners may vote in the SGB Election. Parent will be able to drive onto the school grounds on this day and will be able to vote in the comfort of their vehicles. The time slots have been carefully chosen to ensure minimal effort on behalf of the parents and staff and also with health and safety in mind.

The election process is run by our School Electoral Officer (SEO), who is Mr R Abrahams, Principal of Tamboerskloof Primary School. It is essential to have some form of identification to be able to vote (ID book or card, Driver's License or Passport) as the SEO does not know you. Please come and cast your vote. If the weather is bad on voting day, we have an alternative arrangement to vote in our Seminar Room.


