Dear Parents

We have arrived at the end of the Second Term and we have three weeks of holidays to look forward to.

By now you will have your child's report in your hands and below I offer some comments on how to look at this valuable document.

Understanding Your Childs Report

We pride ourselves on producing a very comprehensive report at the end of each term. On the report we have your child's results in each subject, which you can compare to the class average. So obviously if they are getting above the class average this means they are strong in that subject.

We also ask each teacher to add a subject comment. This is useful in it allows you insight into what is happening in that specific subject. Is your child a pleasure to teach, an asset to the class? Are they disruptive, distracted or lazy? Do they not do their homework, is their low result due to incomplete work or work not handed in? If a child gets a low mark, below class average but has a teacher's comment about their hard work and diligent application this should raise the questions, is this the correct subject? The comments are very useful.

Then at the bottom of the report will be a statement about how they have done overall. If there is 'Promoted' this means they have passed. On the other hand a 'Not promoted' means they have failed. At this point in the year this makes no difference to their future as they still have 6 months left in their Grade. However, it does give you as a parent an early warning. Things will need to change over the next 6 months to allow them to be 'promoted' to the next grade after their end of year exams.

Included in this report is the Term 3 Calendar. Some dates have been changed since we issued the 2018 calendar at the end of 2017. We include the Term 3 Calendar at the end of the Newsletter.

Update on Camps Bay Primary School Expansion

After 100 years of serving the community as a bowling club, the land across the street from the Preparatory Campus looks more and more certain of becoming available to serve as an extension of the Camps Bay Primary School grounds.

The next step will be for the Department of Public Works to lease the land on behalf of the Department of Education, who in turn will make the land available for the purpose of education.

We hope to have some certainty over the club's intentions; we have heard formally that although the Supreme Court of Appeal has refused its application to appeal, the club intends approaching the Constitutional Court. However, we are informed, through numerous calls from service providers who are sub lessees, that they have been given notice to vacate the premises by Friday. Through information on social media, we understand that the club intends vacating the premises this Friday. We will let you know as soon as we know the correct position.

Over the last decade the primary school has expanded from two to three classes per Grade to meet the rising demand for quality education, resulting in overcrowding at our school's Prep and Primary campuses. We have provided the Minister with a detailed summary of the spatial requirements and needs for facilities at the school.

The extra space will alleviate the overcrowding on our existing two campuses and allow the provision of extra classrooms and facilities to meet the needs of the school's foundation phase. The facilities required to allow the school to function better and allow every child the opportunity to thrive will include classrooms, play areas and support facilities like therapy rooms, a staff room, after care facilities and a safe stop and drop area.

Auditions for 2019 School Musical

Next term, auditions for the 2019 School Musical will be held. We are incredibly excited to announce that next year's production will be something truly unique and groundbreaking for high school theatre productions.

Mr. Cross has commissioned top theatre maker, designer, writer and educator, *Penelope Youngleson* to write our school play! Penny has won numerous theatrical awards, including: Runner-up for Best International Production at Amsterdam Fringe, Panel Selection at Afrovibes Festival in Netherlands, two Standard Bank Ovation Awards, three Silver Standard Bank Ovation Awards, a Gold Standard Bank Ovation Award, and a Fleur du Cap Award for Best New Director.

Dancers to Perform in Borne Free at Artscape

Some of the Camps Bay High School dancers have been selected to perform in *BORNE FREE* which takes place at Artscape Theatre Centre on **4th** and **5th July**.

The production is produced and choreographed by *Marlin Zoutman* and *Celeste Botha* from New World Dance Theatre and sees dancers from a variety of schools, performing in a world-class production.

Young Men's Adventure Camp - 9 to 14 July 2018

There was a time when the men in a village would take the young men off into the wilderness and give them a series of challenges in order for them to discover qualities they had inside them already.

In today's modern society, parents often don't have the time to do this or single moms are raising young men alone. Father figures are very important in the lives of young men and *Vic van Heerden*, our Facilities Manager, wants to give young men from Camps Bay High School, who may not have had this kind of opportunity, the chance to have an Adventure Week in the wilderness.

The opportunity is available **FREE OF CHARGE** to young men between the ages of **13 to 16**, who perhaps don't have an ever-present father figure in their lives. Mr. Van Heerden runs the camp in his personal capacity and works on Christian ethos. The young men will go to a working citrus farm near Citrusdal where some of the activities they will do include:

- A tractor ride and tour of the citrus farm;
- A Mountain hike to see the Khoi-San/Bushmen paintings;
- A visit to the hot springs in Citrusdal;
- Horse Riding;
- Zip-lining;
- Star-gazing;
- Making and shooting catapults and shooting them;
- Pellet gun shooting.

Mr. van Heerden will also give these young men, as any father should, perspectives on respect for oneself, respect for others and women and help give them the life skills to deal with peer pressures such as smoking, drinking, drug abuse, etc.


The Honourable Albie Sachs to Talk on Mandela Day

We are delighted to be able to confirm that the *Honourable Albie Sachs* will be talking in a special edition cultural slot on **Wednesday, 18 July 2018** at **10h10**. Judge Sachs will talk about Nelson Mandela: the leader and his lifetime friend.

Judge Sachs became a political activist at the tender age of 17 and worked tirelessly and bravely to bring down the apartheid regime. He has endured much hardship in his lifetime in his fight for justice including spending 90 days in solitary confinement, an attempted assassination in which he was gravely injured and living the life of a political exile for 24 years.

Nelson Mandela appointed Albie Sachs to one of the 11 seats on the country's new Constitutional Court. In his 15 years on the Court, Sachs helped place South African justice in the forefront of the legal recognition of human rights, winning praise from fellow jurists all over the free world.

Judge Sachs now lives in Clifton with his wife Vanessa September, who is the Chairperson of the Primary School Governing Body, and his son Oliver, currently a pupil at Camps Bay Primary School. This talk is not to be missed and parents are welcome, as always, to join Assembly and listen to Judge Sachs' personal accounts of his friendship with Mr. Mandela.



Over the past few years, one of our parents, *Colleen Stoltzman*, has volunteered her time to help with the gardens at our school. Amongst others, she removed poisonous and overgrown Oleanders and replaced them with 15 indigenous, water wise, False Olives (*Buddleja Saligna*).

Despite the gale-force South-Easter wind, they have had to endure a severe drought to boot. Yet, they have established themselves well and soon these trees will offer welcome shade to our children.

In order for these trees to mature successfully and create “umbrella” shade, we now need to stake them with a more robust structure, which will last 6 - 10 years.

Eskom implements shock load shedding

Eskom has declared a power system emergency at extremely short notice and implemented load shedding for the second time in less than 24 hours. Read more below:

The City of Cape Town advises residents that it is able to operate the schedule as before, and avert low levels of load shedding if consumption remains low. Residents are however advised to be prepared for periods without power.

Due to spare generation capacity available at the Steenbras pumped storage scheme at the time, residents of Cape Town were spared the first two blocks of outages, between 12h00-14h00 and 14h00-16h00 as these were applicable to off-peak times. But when consumption increases during peak periods it is likely that power will need to be conserved. Residents are advised to familiarize themselves with the schedule available on the City's website to know when to expect their area to be without power and to prepare accordingly.

'We are entirely dependent on Eskom informing us of what their generation capacity will be so unfortunately we are at this point unable to provide residents with more detailed information on what to expect. However we believe that there is a risk that load shedding will continue to be implemented throughout the next week,' said Cllr Xanthea Limberg, Mayoral Committee Member for Informal Settlements, Water and Waste Services; and Energy.

'Our teams were given a few minutes' notice yesterday evening that they would need to trigger load shedding operations, and this was amidst conflicting messages from the parastatal, so we urge residents to be on guard and prepared for this eventuality at all times.

'We ask that residents please do everything possible to keep consumption to a minimum. If residents are using a lot of energy then there is not much left to spare of the Steenbras surplus. We are especially grateful for the power generated by the Steenbras pumped storage scheme as it allowed our Muslim residents to celebrate Eid without having to sit down to a cold lunch.

'We further ask that residents please do not phone the call centre about power outage unless more than 30 minutes has passed beyond the scheduled period for their area, as this will overload the staff.

'We are hopeful that, given the typically reduced loads of consumption over the weekend, we will not need to resort to load shedding. We will continue to monitor the situation and our electricity control centre remains on standby. We will continue to do everything possible to reduce the impact on Cape Town's residents,' said Cllr Limberg

Preparing for an outage

- Charge your phone;
- Fill your tank – petrol station pumps don't work during outages;
- Have some cash handy as ATMs won't work;
- Switch electric garage doors and security gates to manual operation;
- Make sure you have torches, batteries, candles and matches, and put them somewhere where they can be easily found in the dark;
- Keep boiled water in a thermos flask for hot drinks.

Outage Tips:

Switch off and unplug all electronics and appliances when the power is due to go off as it may come back with a spike in the voltage, which can damage electronic devices such as computers, television sets, DVD players, etc.

If your electricity remains off for longer than the period specified in the schedule, SMS the City's technical operations centre on **31220**. The restoration of power sometimes results in what is described as 'nuisance tripping', which often goes unreported due to the assumption that the outage is due to load shedding.

The City of Cape Town will communicate further as and when more information becomes available.
