### Dear Parents,

This morning in Assembly we acknowledged Chris Hani, who was assassinated 26 years ago on Wednesday this week. (10 April 1993). While as parents, you will remember him and his contribution to the struggle, all our children were born after this tragic event.

Tomorrow morning, we are going to Jan van Riebeeck High School for our first Derby in a number of years. We believe we are evenly matched in that we are both co-ed schools of similar size and are serving pupils from roughly the same areas. The matches start at **08h30 a.m.** (see attached programme and map further on).

It is compulsory for the Grade 8s and 9s to support this event. All learners supporting must be in school uniform. This will contribute to the overall support of our teams and the enjoyment of the day. For the senior grades this is not compulsory but we encourage them to come (in uniform) and cheer for their friends.

You may remember that our school focused on 'gratitude' last year. The first rugby side have decided to make this a part of their game. So when you see them kneeling on the field each player is saying thank you in their own way for those things they are grateful for.

**Netball** will be played at the school in Kloof Street, Rugby at the Boshoffveld and Hockey at the Die Hoop Avenue fields.



If you would prefer to make a monetary donation, there will be two money boxes, one in the library and one at the front office.


### **ACTA Cutest Pet Competition**





Gardens 7-0! Well done to Jaime Augoustides who scored four goals.


### **Under 16 Boys' Soccer**




