



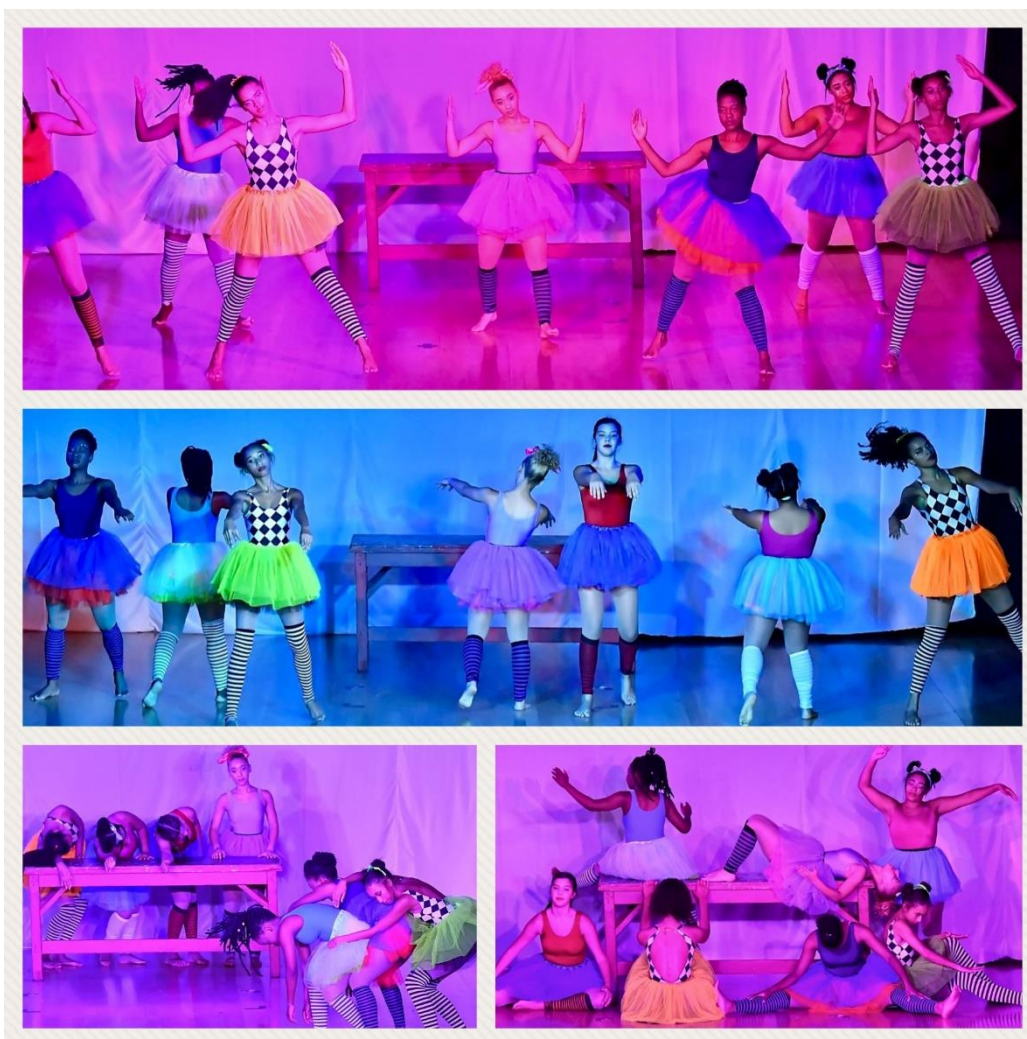

TAXI STRIKES

The ongoing taxi strike has really negatively impacted some of our pupils who have been 'stranded' in town or 'dumped' at the traffic department by the taxis. We have been sending the school bus through to collect them when this has been possible, but not everyone needing lifts has been able to get them. It seems so unfair that our children are disadvantaged by the taxi drivers' issues and the bottom line is that they are missing out on teaching and learning, as we lead up to the exams. Let's hope their issues are resolved by next week.



EXAMS

The midyear exams are the first time that we stop teaching and formally examine the content and skills that have been taught for the first 6 months of the year. The aim is to assess how much of the work has been mastered. The good news is that these exams are a 'formative' process, meaning that after the exams we will have time to go over them and ensure that pupils are able to learn from their mistakes.

I therefore ask you as parents to assist in whatever way you can to ensure that your child gives their very best for each and every exam they write. Your help can range from actively going over their work with them, to creating a home environment that is conducive to studying. Having a disciplined study plan or timetable is vital and this is definitely a place that you could start the conversation around your child's exam preparation. As I said in assembly today, the aim is not to catch them out or expose them, but rather to allow them to show that they have mastered the work and can do it. We want each pupil to produce their very best.

Crochet Pattern

MATERIALS

ELLE FAMILY KNIT DK (50 g)

(Colour of your choice)

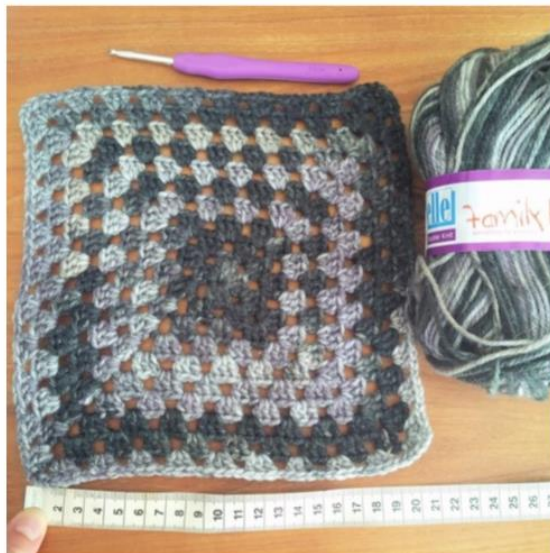
4 mm crochet hook

MEASUREMENTS

20 cm x 20 cm square

ABBREVIATIONS

ch = chain	rnd = round
chsp = chain space	slst = slip stitch
cont = continue	sp = space
patt = pattern	st(s) = stitch(es)
rep = repeat	tr = treble
	rnd = round



INSTRUCTIONS

Using a 4 mm hook make 4ch, slst in first ch to form a ring.

1st rnd: 5ch (= 1tr, 2ch), (3tr in ring, 2ch) 3 times, 2tr in ring, slst in 3rd of 5ch.

2nd rnd: Slst in chsp, 5ch (= 1tr, 2ch), 3tr in same sp, *1ch, (3tr, 2ch, 3tr) in next chsp (= corner), rep from * twice, 1ch, 2tr in same sp as 5ch, slst in 3rd of 5ch.

3rd rnd: Slst in chsp, 5ch (= 1tr, 2ch), 3tr in same sp, *1ch, 3tr in next sp, 1ch**, (3tr, 2ch, 3tr) in next sp, rep from * twice and from * to ** once, 2tr in same sp as 5ch, slst in 3rd of 5ch.

4th rnd: Slst in chsp, 5ch (= 1tr, 2ch), 3tr in same sp, *(1ch, 3tr in next chsp) twice, 1ch**, (3tr, 2ch, 3tr) in next sp, rep from * twice and from * to ** once, 2tr in same sp at 5ch, slst in 3rd of 5ch.

5th to 10th rnd: Cont in patt as last rnd working 3tr in each 1chsp, 1ch after each 3tr cluster and in each corner work 3tr, 2ch, 3tr.

Measure your square and if 20 x 20cm, Fasten off.

If not, do one more round and then fasten off and work in your loose ends.

Knitting Pattern

MATERIALS

ELLE CHARITY DK (100 g)

(Colour of your choice)

6mm Knitting Needles

MEASUREMENTS

20 cm x 20 cm square



INSTRUCTIONS

Using 6 mm knitting needles, cast on 30 st.

*Knit one row

Purl one row*

Repeat from * to * until work measures 20cm.

Cast off & work in your loose ends.
