

Dear Parents.

SAM WARREN AWARDED LIFESAVING HERO AWARD

In assembly on Monday I recounted the story of one of our Life Savers, Sam Warren, who received a 'Hero Award' from Life Saving Western Province. I include the citation that accompanied the award:

Sam Warren while on holiday at his grandmother's beach house was alerted to the fact that two members of the public had pulled a drowning person from the sea. He ran out onto the beach where the 2 members of the public who had pulled the victim from the water were attempting to perform CPR on the victim. Sam took charge of the resuscitation, made more difficult by the rapidly rising tide and the gathering crowd. The patient was vomiting and issuing copious froth, he had an intermittent pulse but was not breathing. Sam was joined by two lifeguards from Big Bay Surf Lifesaving Club. They joined Sam in rotation, allowing the members of the public to retire. About 15 minutes after that, the paramedics arrived and the victim was moved out of the tidal zone to the pavement, where all three of the lifeguards continued CPR in rotation with the paramedics. After apporximately an hour the patient was declared dead. Lifesaving Western Province commends Sam on his efforts in taking charge of the situation and performing CPR.

SUMMER SPORTS AWARDS 2019





Crochet Pattern

MATERIALS

ELLE FAMILY KNIT DK (50 g)

(Colour of your choice)

4 mm crochet hook

MEASUREMENTS

20 cm x 20 cm square

ABBREVIATIONS

/ IDDI IL VII I I I I I I I	
ch = chain	rnd = round
chsp = chain	slst = slip
space	stitch
cont =	sp = space
continue	92
patt = pattern	st(s) =
	stitch(es)
rep = repeat	tr = treble
	rnd = round



INSTRUCTIONS

Using a 4 mm hook make 4ch, slst in first ch to form a ring.

1st rnd: 5ch (= 1tr, 2ch), (3tr in ring, 2ch) 3 times, 2tr in ring, slst in 3rd of 5ch.

2nd rnd: Slst in chsp, 5ch (= 1tr, 2ch), 3tr in same sp, *1ch, (3tr, 2ch, 3tr) in next chsp (= corner), rep from * twice, 1ch, 2tr in same sp as 5ch, slst in 3rd of 5ch.

3rd rnd: Slst in chsp, 5ch (= 1tr, 2ch), 3tr in same sp, *1ch, 3tr in next sp, 1ch**, (3tr, 2ch, 3tr) in next sp, rep from * twice and from * to ** once, 2tr in same sp as 5ch, slst in 3rd of 5ch.

4th rnd: Slst in chsp, 5ch (= 1tr, 2ch), 3tr in same sp, *(1ch, 3tr in next chsp) twice, 1ch**, (3tr, 2ch, 3tr) in next sp, rep from * twice and from * to ** once, 2tr in same sp at 5ch, slst in 3rd of 5ch.

5th to 10th rnd: Cont in patt as last rnd working 3tr in each 1chsp, 1ch after each 3tr cluster and in each corner work 3tr, 2ch, 3tr.

Measure your square and if 20 x 20cm, Fasten off.

If not, do one more round and then fasten off and work in your loose ends.

Knitting Pattern

MATERIALS

ELLE CHARITY DK (100 g)

(Colour of your choice)

6mm Knitting Needles

MEASUREMENTS

20 cm x 20 cm square

INSTRUCTIONS

Using 6 mm knitting needles, cast on 30 st.

*Knit one row

Purl one row*

Repeat from * to * until work measures 20cm.

Cast off & work in your loose ends.
